Unique among ski destinations worldwide, France features linked ski resorts within four separate domains that allow visitors to ski from resort to resort without ever having to descend from the slopes. Perfect for skiers of all levels, from beginners to experts, visitors can explore and admire breathtaking alpine views and bask in luxury at the many four and five-star hotels. Attracting a cosmopolitan clientele keen on both vigorous exercise and pleasure, the area boasts high quality ski trails and lifts, superb snow parks and high altitude skiing for guaranteed snow.

[Les Trois Vallées](#) is the largest ski domain in the world and is a must for skiers looking for huge vertical drops, gourmet food easily accessible from the ski runs and lively nightlife. Featuring more than 375 miles of ski trails among the ski stations [Courchevel](#), [Méribel](#), La Tania, [Les Menuires](#), [Val Thorens](#), Saint Martin de Belleville and Orelle, Les Trois Vallées offers a wide variety of scenery, state-of-the-art ski lifts and exacting security standards to ensure the safety of all visitors. Each of the different resorts also has its own architectural style and character, enabling guests to choose the place to stay that suits them best.

Located only a few miles from Les Trois Vallées, the domain [Paradiski](#) brings together the ski stations of [La Plagne](#), [Les Arcs](#) and Peisey Vallandry. At altitudes between 4,000 to 10,000 feet, this skiers' paradise features more than 260 miles of ski trails interweaving through forest and peaks, where skiers can take on challenging off-trail descents. The domain also features the Vanoise Express, a double-decker cable car, which can carry 4,000 people per hour. All of the resorts are car-free, with skiing from resort to resort and offer a myriad of family-friendly facilities.

For those who yearn to ski in the tracks of champions, the vast and prestigious [Espace Killy](#), named after three-time French Olympic gold medal winner Jean-Claude Killy, hailing from Val d'Isère, is the perfect destination, with 190 miles of ski trails between [Val d'Isère](#) and [Tignes](#). Espace Killy is particularly renowned for hosting many prestigious competitions, including the Critérium de la Première Neige in Val d'Isère (an Alpine Ski World Cup event) and the X Games Europe in Tignes. Along with high-level skiing and guaranteed snow, the two resorts are havens of peace and quiet where guests can relax in some of France's best luxury hotels.

Straddling the Franco-Swiss border, [Portes du Soleil](#) includes twelve linked resorts with [Morzine](#), Avoriaz, [Les Gets](#), Châtel, Montriond, St Jean d'Aulps and La Chapelle d'Abondance in France plus Champéry, Val d'illiez-Les Crozets-Champoussin, Morgins and Torgnon in Switzerland. Featuring a stunning view of the nearby Mont Blanc, guests can spend the morning skiing and then take a lunch break at an authentic restaurant featuring the best of Savoyarde cuisine.



This natural powder reserve at the heart of the Alps offers skiers pristine surroundings, mountain lifts that are hidden amid the snow-covered forest, runs that wind their way through snow meadows and quaint mountain chalets. The ski area enjoys exceptionally good snowfall from mid-November to the end of April, with an average of 25.69 ft of powder every year. A veritable “ski safari,” visitors can ski not only between resorts within the domain but can also cross the Franco-Swiss border on skis.

Les Gets

Known as Porte du Soleil's eco-friendly ski resort, the village of Les Gets has been a strong proponent of sustainable tourism, focusing on preserving and enhancing the natural environment. The resort's green features include:

Le Grand Cry Videototem

Perfect for families, this Native American themed snow sports area features tepees offering face-painting workshops and a trappers' hut, as well as other games. Children can also make their own rain dance or song video, which they can then download to the internet and share with friends.

The Deborah Anthonioz Boardercross Course

This boardercross course was developed and designed with input from Les Gets native and ambassador, Deborah Anthonioz, the women's Olympic boardercross silver medal-winner at the Vancouver Winter Games in 2010. Rock the Pistes: the Season's Flagship Event

Portes du Soleil invites visitors to Rock the Pistes, a one-of-a-kind festival from March 26th to March 30th, 2014, combining snow sports and music. Morzine

An early pioneer of skiing with the construction of the third French cable car in 1934, Morzine has preserved its authentic village charm while also developing tourism in a sustainable manner at its high-quality winter sports resort. Morzine is innovating and investing to make its ski area more easily accessible by installing the very latest in ski lifts.

2013/2014 Updates

New Gondola Lifts

Morzine has installed new gondola lifts in the Pléney sector that will be in service at the beginning of the season. These lifts will carry 3,000 skiers per hour, compared to 1,700 people carried by the two old lifts combined.

The “Babysnow”: An Ideal Children’s Activity

Children under three can experience the pleasures of snow sports, thanks to the new “Babysnow.” Resembling a snow scooter or an adapted snowboard, it offers children from the age of one (once the child can stand) the chance to experience snow sports for the first time. This activity is available exclusively with the École du Ski Français in Morzine .

Le Chemin des Zouzous

This new run in the Pléney sector opens the doors to the animal world for the youngest skiers. The 1.2-mile educational trail features life-size reproductions of wild animals, offering an original way to learn about the local fauna.

Anniversary of the École du Ski Français

The École du Ski Français will celebrate its 75th birthday in February 2014, where the resort's ski instructors, nicknamed the ‘Pulls Rouges,’ will showcase their superb skills.

Ranging from 3,937 to 10,662 ft in altitude, Paradiski is a 264-mile ski domain linking the resorts of Les Arcs, Peisey-Vallandry and La Plagne. Well-known for its beautiful scenery, Paradiski is located at the entrance to the Vanoise National Park, a natural protected area of 205 square miles. With 70% of its slopes above 6,561 ft and a plethora of top quality snow, Paradiski ensures optimum snow conditions from December to April.

Paradiski celebrates 10 years of the Vanoise Express Cable Car

On December 20th, 2003, skiers embarked for the first time on the Vanoise Express cable car. To celebrate this anniversary, Paradiski has asked the haute-couture designer, Jean-Charles DeCasteljacob, to decorate the Vanoise Express. The world-renowned artist and innovator will decorate the double-decker Vanoise Express cable cars, on display during the winter of 2013/2014.

Paradiski Gravity

This year Paradiski is hosting “Paradiski Gravity” on December 16th, 2013. A world first in "highline," the high-altitude slack line will be strung between two cable cars 1,246 ft high. Two of the world's best 'highliners,' Julien Millot and Tancrede Melet will negotiate their way along the rope, which will be suspended over the valley between the two cable cars of the Vanoise Express, defying gravity against a breathtaking backdrop.

Largest Igloo Village

Following the first winter’s success, Les Arcs’ Igloo Village comes back even bigger and better, announcing two exciting new updates:

- An even bigger village (4,305 square ft, exclusive to France) comprising an ice sculpture gallery and several new rooms inviting guests to spend the night.
- Igloo rooms, inviting nature lovers to immerse themselves for one night in an arctic atmosphere, comfortably cocooned in expedition duvets.

Les Arcs

A ski- in/ski-out resort established in 1968, Les Arcs is a perfect example of the integration of modern architecture into the natural landscape. Consisting of four interconnected, car-free, high altitude locations, Les Arcs is constantly evolving through innovation and ambition. Facing Mont Blanc at the foot of the Aiguille Rouge (10,584 ft) and featuring an Arolla pine forest, Arc 2000 has one of the longest slopes in Europe with a height differential of 6,975 ft.

2013/2014 Updates

La Plagne

La Plagne is a family winter sports and summer resort located in the French Alps between 4,100 to 10,662 ft. Internationally renowned for its expansive ski area ideal for all levels, La Plagne is committed to improving skier experience and the quality of its customer service.

From traditional to altitude villages, La Plagne has over 53,387 beds spread over ten destinations. The atmosphere and architecture are diverse and recount over 50 years of the history of winter sports.

2013/2014 Updates

France's only bobsleigh track

La Plagne boasts France's only bobsleigh track and is one of only seven in Europe. Built for the Albertville Olympic Games in 1992, the track has since been developed for tourist descents and is the resort's top après-ski activity. From mid-December to April, tourists can experience the thrill of descending at speeds between 50 and 75 miles/hr in one of three special machines, making La Plagne's track one of just seven in the world to offer this possibility to the general public.

Moguls and Ski Cross World Cup Finals

A few weeks after the Olympic Games from March 19th to 23rd, 2014, the best international athletes, including the Olympic medal winners, will compete for the Moguls and Ski Cross World Cup finals at La Plagne's stadium "Jean Luc Crétier," renovated in 2012.

Named after France's most famous skier, the Espace Killy comprises the two renowned ski resorts of Tignes (6,889 ft) and Val d'Isère (6,069 ft). It offers a total ski area of 189 miles with a wide range of terrain and some of the best backcountry skiing in Europe. The area is one of the most snow-sure in Europe and offers skiing virtually year-round, thanks to the Pissailas Glacier and La Grande Motte Glacier. Founded by the British skier Major Lindsay, Méribel is known as the first resort in Les Trois Vallées. The resort embodies the charm of an authentic alpine village, with wooden and stone chalets scattered around the mountain.
