A Word From Raymond Vidil

Taking the form of a declaration of love to the arts, the artists, and the entire territory, *MP2018* aims to bring the entire Bouches-du-Rhône Department alive to the rhythm of culture and creation from across the artistic spectrum. This event has been imagined as a seven-month odyssey through the arts starting on 14 February 2018, and nothing better encapsulates the joy and the emotion of the project than its very name: *Quel Amour!*

Five years after the triumph of Marseille-Provence 2013, European Capital of Culture, the territory's major cultural organisations have joined forces with the economic community to create an artistic event that will resonate on a national and international scale. The all-embracing dynamic of the project will help position the Bouches-du-Rhône as one of the world's top cultural destinations in 2018.

From Marseille to Martigues and from Aix-en-Provence to Arles, passing through Aubagne, Istres, Salon-de-Provence, and Cassis along the way, *MP2018* is a collective project of the very highest artistic standards. The entire event is underpinned by a desire to present the territory's cultural riches, to allow people to discover the glorious local landscapes, and to foster the movement of people and artworks throughout the area.

The French government, the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur Region, the Bouches-du-Rhône Department, the City of Marseille, and the other partner cities are committed to making *MP2018* a monumental success. They are united by the common goals of creating an event that is inspiring, positive, and open to all - *Quel Amour!* - and helping to support the incredible power of artistic creation.

A Collaborative & Territory-Wide Arts Project

After the tremendous success of MP2013, the major decision-makers in the Bouches-du-Rhône Department decided it was essential to create another arts event that would unite the territo-ry's cultural, economic, and tourism interests. Thus was born MP2018, Quel Amour!, a world-class arts event that is open to everybody and breaks free from the traditional formats of festivals and biennales.

The MPCulture association was created to bring together leaders from the cultural, business, and university communities and provide them with a vehicle to support the project.

The founding members—the Mécènes du Sud, the Club Top 20, the Chamber of Commerce and Industry Marseille Provence, and Aix-Marseille University—are motivated by the common desire to work together to create an arts event of international dimensions.

MPCulture has entrusted the creation of an intersecting, multidisciplinary programme to an artistic steering committee made up of leaders from 15 of the territory's preeminent cultural organisations.

Each member of the steering committee serves as a guarantor of the event's creative value and editorial harmony while also serving as an ambassador for MP2018 in their cultural communities.

Beginning in early 2017, members of the steering committee began meeting with their networks of cultural organisations and artists and invited them to propose collective projects for the event. Close to 500 cultural organisations in the Bouches-du-Rhône took part in these initial consultations, resulting in 170 proposals. Along with the 65 collective projects that were ultimately selected through this process, there are also creations that have been specifically commissioned by MP2018 and the members of the artistic steering committee in their roles as artistic directors. Each of the 15 committee members has ensured that their cultural organisation will embrace the MP2018 spirit by dedicating a part of their 2018 programme to the Quel Amour! theme.

In the end, the 200 arts projects chosen for the official MP2018 programme are those capable of either being moved throughout the department or inspiring people to move through the department themselves in order to ensure that the event is accessible to the greatest number of people possible. Quel Amour! offers something for everyone: street parties, exhibitions, artistic residencies, installations, theatre, opera, concerts, contemporary dance, circus, distinctive happenings both in cities and out in nature...

A Collective Dynamic

Founding Members





The Chamber of Commerce and Industry Marseille Provence (CCIMP) represents the interests of 94 000 companies in Aix-Marseille-Provence and supports them in their business endeavours. Its combined mission is to meet the daily needs of the business community and enhance the territory's international reputation. The CCIMP, which is presided over by Jean-Luc Chauvin, is supporting this project to shine a spotlight on Aix-Marseille-Provence and to consolidate the territory's position as a leader in Southern Europe and in the Mediterranean basin.

The Club Top 20 brings together 40 major companies from Aix-Marseille-Provence Metropolis that aim to play a role in the continued development of the metro area. Beyond financial support for the arts, the collective also partners with ambitious cultural projects and maintains artist-in-residence programmes at member businesses. Damien Leclère has served as president of the Mécènes du Sud since February 2017.



The recently merged **Aix-Marseille Université (AMU)** is one of the youngest universities in France but it is also the largest in terms of number of students, personnel, and budget. With renowned research units that work in collaboration with national and international organisations, AMU has been classified as a site of excellence by an international jury in the context of the Investments of the Future programme. AMU is presided over by Yvon Berland and today the university serves as one of the pillars of the territory.

Quel Amour !: An Intricate and Unifying Theme

MP2018 has jubilantly captured the spirit of its seven-month programme with a title taken from a popular expression in the South of France: "Quel Amour!". The term "What Love!" isn't as naive as it first appears because its meaning goes far beyond a simple observation of affection; in French, it is also an ardent declaration of passion and a profound inquiry into the possibilities of the heart. As a title, it not only lays a foundation for a diverse array of performances, festivities, concerts, exhibitions, and one-of-a-kind events, it serves as a common thread that both entwines the creations and outlines the love story between the festival and its audiences.

"Quel Amour! A joyful exclamation and a compelling reflection that sends the imagination frolicking. To talk about love through the arts, the artists, and the most human of destinies. An urgent impulse for delight, for the Other, and for the discovery of what is different. An urgent desire to come together and create things of such beauty that they will be loved.

For the audiences and the artists, these two words are an encouragement to dream, to invent new possibilities, to watch, to listen, but also to draw, to speak, to dance, to play, to sing "Quel Amour!" Quel Amour! rings out as a command, an invitation, a confession, an impulse, a protest, even as a gateway to the unknown.

Upon hearing these two words, there is an echo of a secret, intimate question: Quel amour? And, of course, the underlying impatience, the expectation of an answer...

What pleases us and should please you is that this term addresses every person, each of us without exception, a theme that is shared by all, two words that can roam everywhere and touch everything. Because at the heart of this event is the movement and exchange between people in their common pursuit of art, of culture, of the Other. We will be welcoming radiant moments of creation into our museums, our theatres, our workspaces, and we will host them both indoors and out in nature. For this is a matter of both nurturing the desire to circulate among others and to circulate this very desire among others.

Without a doubt, there is a pressing need to inject colour into this world, dancing colours. And Quel Amour! is also a phrase with a certain prophylactic notion, a barrier against the threat of intolerance in these uncertain times. Quel Amour! is a glimpse into the Other that can serve as an antidote to despair. Celebrate love, love that is never complete and never perfect, and celebrate caring for others in this world that is so astonishing. We are proposing that we live this promise together...

... in the knowledge that we remain free to love."



The 10 Hallmarks of the Project

1

A unique and exemplary approach to

The Legacy of MP2013 European Capital of Culture

Marseille-Provence 2013, European Capital of Culture, was an undeniable popular success that transformed the image of the department by revealing the extraordinary energy of the territory. Propelled by an investment in cultural infrastructure that saw ten new venues open including the MuCEM, the FRAC Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur building, and the Tour-Panorama at La Friche la Belle de Mai, the programme attracted large and enthusiastic audiences.

In 2013, the Bouches-du-Rhône moved to the rhythm of the capital of culture for the entire year, from street performances in Marseille to pyrotechnical displays in Arles, from the Industrial Night in Martigues to the opening of the GR®2013 hiking trail, and from the Transhumance to the Circus in Capitals programme that were held across the entire department.

Beyond simply revealing the territory's exceptional natural advantages, MP2013 also changed the image of our territory's urban and cultural landscape, both in the media and among tourists. During this same time, Marseille was named the #2 destination in the world by The New York Times and one of the ten most beautiful coastal cities in the world by National Geographic, confirming the territory's status as a ideal locale for culture, for entrepreneurs, and for tourists. MP2013 sparked a bold new creative dynamic and laid the foundation for a sensational new reputation for the Aix-Marseille-Provence territory, and now MP2018 is seeking to build on this momentum. Over the past five years, the territory has attracted more tourists and more interest from both within France and from around the world. The Bouches-du-Rhône now enjoys a renewed global image and a more coherent place on the world stage. MP2018 intends to continue this remarkable transformation and to strengthen the bonds between culture, nature, and the economy.

MP2018: A Destination

In 2013, the European Capital of Culture was organized within the context of a broader mission to help Marseille rise up and become one of the Top 20 metro areas in Europe. Five years later, the sweeping improvements generated by this catalyst have now become permanent cultural and economic fixtures. To cite but one example, the City of Marseille now welcomes five million tourists a year (2016 statistics) compared to two million tourists a year in 2012. As an initiative that is being organised in cooperation with the territory's tourism sector, the MP2018 event aims to continue this impressive dynamic by once again using culture as a major draw for tourists. Bouches-du-Rhône Tourisme, the Comité Régional du Tourisme, and the Office du Tourisme de Marseille are all supporting MP2018 and have the shared ambition of creating a collective, territory-wide cultural event. This type of common commitment, with its associated financial contributions and joint coordination, is emblematic of the cooperative spirit of MP2018.

The Budget

The budget for MP2018 is set at 5.5 million euros. Of this total, 50% comes from private partners, 36% comes from subsidies from public partners, and 14% comes from resources that have been carried over from the organisation of MP2013.

In addition to the public subsidies, there are also in-kind contributions and services offered by various governmental bodies including material, venues, security, logistics support, signage, and cleaning and maintenance.

Another financial factor to be considered is the cost of the MP2018 programming that is being directly paid by either the cultural institutions represented by the artistic steering committee or the cities that are partners in the MP2018 programme.



MP2018 is inviting young audiences to lead the way for the seven-month arts programme. This engagement is an important message that MP2018 is sending to the territory's residents. It gives concrete expression to the mutual commitment that all the project's partners—the French state, the local governments, the education community, and the cultural sector—have made to provide cultural and artistic educational opportunities for young people.

This is a one-of-a-kind initiative that is symbolic of the overall spirit of the project. It is made possible thanks to the enduring commitment of the French national government, which has provided continued support for major cultural infrastructure in the territory since Marseille-Provence 2013, European Capital of Culture.

An agreement signed between the MPCulture association and education authorities from the Rectorat de l'Académie d'Aix-Marseille has made it possible for all the primary school classes in the Bouches-du-Rhône to be involved in this event thanks to the distribution of an Art Case to each primary school class in the department as well as training for the teachers who will be using them. This creative object embodies all of the artistic and cultural objectives laid out by the Ministry of Culture and National Education and brings together artists and cultural organisations.

An art education using art that will touch every single child across the territory and, through these young people, their families too.



PROVENCE-ALPES-CÔTE D'AZUR REGION

Culture is one of our priorities. There has been a 9% increase in funding to this sector compared to 2016, bringing the region's overall culture budget to close to 58 million euros for 2017.

We have decided to increase our support for the major cultural organisations and the major cultural festivals as they have become engines of the tourism economy, creating both jobs and wealth.

The PACA region is a primary financial supporter of Marseille-Provence 2018 with a total commitment of $500\ 000$, including $300\ 000$ eallocated in the 2017 financial year. We have chosen to fully embrace and support this ambitious and unifying cultural event that will unite a territory that has endless potential.

We are overjoyed that this new collective project is founded on a cooperation between the public institutions that are providing funding and the broader economic community. THE COMPAGNIE FRUITIÈRE ENDOWMENT FUND

The Compagnie Fruitière Endowment Fund was created in 2012 at the behest of Robert Fabre, the president of the Compagnie Fruitière. Its objective is to further the corporate responsibility efforts initiated by the company. In Africa, the Fund works with NGOs and associations to improve the quality of life for the most underserved communities by providing access to electricity, clean water, medical care, and education. Beginning 2016, the Fund has also worked in France, notably in Marseille, by supporting projects in the domains of health, education, culture, and the environment. Among the partners it has worked with in 2017 are the French Red Cross, the HumaniTerra NGO, the Fondation de France, and the Association Massabielle.

Fostering arts education in schools and encouraging access to culture for all communities are among the main objectives of the Compagnie Fruitière Endowment Fund. For MP2018, we have chosen to support a first-of-its-kind artistic initiative: the creation of an Art Case and the production of 4500 of these cases to be distributed to every single primary school in the Bouches-du-Rhône Department. 115 000 children will benefit both from this tailor-made educational tool and the associated opening festivities on 14 February that will be specially dedicated to young audiences.

MP2018 Quel Amour! The Programme

Seven months of arts programming captured in a few key projects.

(Document published in October 2017, programme may be modified.)

A Word From the Artistic Steering Committee

We had the bold dream that a love story could be written as a collective. And MP2018 was born out of this audacity.

➡ An audacious collaboration:

We transformed our differences into our strength by using 15 distinct creative visions to shape the artistic programme and by using an alliance of diverse projects initiated by the separate cultural organisations to make the programme a reality.

→ An audacious sense of space and time:

There is no fixed centre or traditional date for this event, it is spread across the Bouches-du-Rhône and it will last for seven months with no regard for standard artistic seasons.

→ An audacious programme :

With a multidisciplinary programme embracing an elusive theme, grand, ostentatious projects have been set aside in favour of a diversity of ideas. We do not consider a single notion of love in XXL format, instead we evoke a multitude of versions of love and its most unexpected manifestations. We speak of love in a host of languages, we yell it from the rooftops and we whisper it in ears. There have been no grand commissions, merely a grand embrace of the arts. Nothing monumental, only phenomenal. A philosophy of artistic programming fundamentally different from current practices, a philosophy that invests its energy into original and unique ways of being, in the very image of our territory.

Quel Amour ! is a guideline for this event, but one that is respected with a certain impertinence. We take pleasure in the metaphor of love, in following its leitmotivs and playing amidst its refrains, in exploring romantic and fraternal love, the love of risks or the love nature. The heart of this event has a tempo of five beats, a pulsation in those five letters of French love A-M-O-U-R, for five separate episodes that are influenced by both the major theme and a series of unique, unclassifiable moments.

Everything starts with Valentine's Day. With

the letter A, our opening festivities begin on 14 February as love is celebrated in a new light. To begin, a special presentation of the Sirènes et midi net arts event will be held on the Parvis of the Opéra de Marseille to launch two days of programming dedicated to young people. Then, on the weekend of 17 and 18 February, audiences will be enraptured by two days and two nights of artistic effervescence that will unfold across the territory, culminating in a legendary Big Kiss...

After that and until 20 April, the letter M

will feature an exploration of love both in body and in act with the Love, What a Circus! programme as well as a presentation of a repertoire of classics connected to the theme with I Love Classics! For those who yearn for the streets, April will also have Love of the Open Road events that will facilitate a unique discovery of metropolitan spaces. Urban strolls or wild hikes will provide people with bold new perspectives on our territory.

Starting 21 April, the letter O has us "Running the streets" on the tail of artistic projects infatuated with urban spaces: whole weeks dedicated to the creativity of the local hip hop scene will make way for fraternal engagements, celebrated in live shows, visual arts projects and land art under the banner of "Cross-border Loves"

Then, beginning on 16 June, the letter U

pays homage to the 50th anniversary of the May 1968 student revolution with a Summer of Love that will see all the major festivals embrace the spirit of Quel Amour!


Last but not least, the letter R remains mysterious, guarding its secrets until the surprise events of the closing weekend...

The rhythm of MP2018 will be accentuated by several major exhibitions over the seven months of the festival. Among them, the artists **JR** and **Korakrit Arunanondchai** have been given carte blanche to create installations inspired by Marseille at the J1 hangar. At the [mac] contemporary art museum, Quel Amour!?, the title exhibition for MP2018, will open on 9 May with a selection of works that testify to the permanent role that the motif of love plays in artistic creation.

Throughout the artistic odyssey that is Quel Amour!, there will be Enduring Love events that will run for months at the time, such as the invitation to navigate the salty waters of artistic cuisine with Your Sea, Love of the Sea, to try your hand at graphic creation with the happy adventure that is Estampette by Fotokino, or to abandon yourself to poetic wanderings along the GR2013© trail with Thousand and One Nights...when suddenly a caravan arrives: it's Wandering Love, with a series of concerts that move from city to city and place to place.

From Martigues to Salon, from Istres to Arles, from east to west, from the sea to the land... Get out and move around, there's everything to be seen.

Carte blanche for **JR** and **Korakrit Arunanondchai**


The MJ1 association welcomes MP2018 to the J1 hangar! A symbol of Marseille's industrial and port heritage and one of the most celebrated venues during the European Capital of Culture, the J1 hangar is once again one of the main events. Starting in March 2018, MP2018 will begin holding events in this emblematic building and is giving two internationally renowned artists carte blanche to create exhibitions specifically designed for Quel Amour!



→ JR

The celebrated photographer and street artist JR is taking over the J1 to create a love scene constructed around notions of journeys and Marseille at sea. Marseille, a welcoming harbour, a port of call, a departure point... In this mammoth glass and reinforced-concreted structure, a freighter forever docked looking out over the bay, the artist has envisioned an extravagant installation. For visitors, there will be multiplying ways to travel through the exhibition, both physically and mentally. Moving through the installation, each person will choose their own path and discover images, carpets beneath water. Certain visitors will opt to wander through the space in a random fashion. Others will carefully pick their path according to the photographs that can be glimpsed here and there. Everybody will be able to imagine their own stories, their own routes. And as the installation gradually unfolds before them, each visitor/traveller will be reminded of the existence of a destination that is common to everybody...

→ Born in Paris in 1983, JR is a French contemporary artist and film director. Often taking the form of a photo collage, his work has appeared on walls around the world. In Paris, New York, or Rio, his large-format portraits have reached audiences that don't typically frequent museums. His work explores confrontation, freedom, and identity. In 2017, he co-directed the documentary Visages, Villages with Agnès Varda.



➡ Korakrit Arunanondchai

Korakrit Arunanondchai is a Thai artist living in New York City. At the invitation of Charlotte Cosson & Emmanuelle Luciani on behalf of MP2018, he will be the second artist to be exhibited on the magnificent stage that is the J1 hangar.

For this carte blanche, the artist will explore his preferred themes: spirituality in the globalised world and the friction between animism and modern technology. With Chaman 3.0, Korakrit Arunanondchai has imagined an immersive, large-scale installation that mixes sculpture, sound, and video. In an immobilised landscape made of shells and earth, films from his cycle "Painting with History in a Room Filled With People with Funny Names" are projected in large format to create a type of cinema in broad daylight. Certain forms emerge from the videos, triggering echoes and synchronicities. The J1 structure, like an Atlantis lying above the Mediterranean, adds a geo-temporal layer to an ecosystem that is traditionally interpreted as being of this millennium. To move through the installation gives the sensation of wandering through what may be the substance of our society in the near or not-so-near future. Underpinned by the need for coexistence between all forms of life and by the question of what will be left behind for future civilisations, Korakrit Arunanondchai's installation is an experiment in the possible

consequences of a present that is oriented towards memory, love, and the bonds that unite us.

→ Korakrit Arunanondchai was born in Thailand in 1986 and now lives and works in New York. He left Bangkok to study at the Rhode Island School of Design (2009) and then at Columbia University (2012). After numerous group shows (Sculpture Center, New York; ICA, London), Korakrit Arunanondchai began creating solo shows, notably at MoMA PS1 (New York, 2014), The Mistake Room (Los Angeles, 2014), and at the Palais de Tokyo (Paris, 2015).

→ Charlotte Cosson & Emmanuelle Luciani are art historians and curators. Most recently they organised COOL-As a State of Mind at MAMO (Marseille), From Transhuman to South Perspectives at the Rowing Projects (London), DOMESTIC at Truth & Consequences (Geneva) and Pré-capital. Formes pupulaires et rurales dans l'art contemporain at the invitation of Nicolas Bourriaud at the Panacée (Montpellier). They are editors-in-chief at the arts magazine CODE South Way. They regularly give lectures at the Fondation Vincent Van Gogh in Arles and at the PARADISE/A Space for Screen Addiction, a locale they founded at LECLERE (Marseille). They also have a residence for international artists in Marseille.

Quel Amour !?

{10 may → 31 august} [mac] - Marseille

An exhibition curated by Eric Corne, in association with Thierry Ollat

"Quel Amour !?", a French expression that is an exclamation and an interrogation, a phrase that evokes a universal sentiment, if there is such a thing, but nonetheless takes on different manifestations depending on how it is uttered and in which culture or civilisation it is used. This eponymous exhibition assembles the work of contemporary artists from different generations and different backgrounds whose works bear witness to the permanent role the motif of love plays in artistic creation.

Envisioned as two intertwined artistic experiences, the exhibition invites the visitor to choose their own entrance, even going so far as to temporarily separate themselves from the person they arrived with.... As Ian Curtis and Joy Division predicted in 1980, "Love Will Tear Us Apart."

Photographs, installations, videos, sculptures, and paintings will explore the imminence of feelings, both through collaborations by artists who are couples (**Gilbert & Georges**, **Marina Abramović** and **Ulay**...) and as passionate declarations as embodied by the works of Louise Bourgeois and Charlotte Salomon.

This dialogue between different practices and different perspectives is also manifested in works by feminist artists such as **Pilar Albarracín** or through an immersion into love in the time of AIDs, a fraught deflagration that is found in work from the 1980s by **Nan Goldin** and **Felix Gonzalez Torres**.

Quel Amour!? is also the occasion to commission works from specific artists; prominent among this selection is a piece by **Claude Lévêque** and **Omar Ba** that fuses their visions and their languages in a polyphonic exploration of love's confines.



→ Éric Corne is an artist and a curator.
 In 2001, he founded the contemporary art centre
 Le Plateau in Paris, which he directed until
 2004. After curating numerous international
 exhibitions, he has devoted himself to painting.
 Éric Corne has taught at the École Nationale
 Supérieure d'Art de Bourges since 2008.

→ [mac] musée d'art contemporain de Marseille Installed in a building from the 1970s, [mac] opened its doors to the public in 1994. It features close to 2500 m2 of display space for both its permanent collection and temporary exhibitions that are at the convergence of contemporary art practices. The [mac] is directed by Thierry Ollat, who serves as associate curator for this exhibition. He recently conceived exhibitions such as HIP HOP: Un Âge d'Or with Claire Calogirou and Sebastian Bardin-Greenberg as well as ANDY WARHOL: Time Capsules in 2014 and LE PONT in 2013 for MP2013.

As part of the work commissioned by the Centre National des Arts Plastiques, this exhibition presents the work of 15 photographers who worked across the country to provide a new and original vision of today's youth in France. As a mirror to this exhibition, MP2018 is presenting the project Young Love, which began with an invitation to students from several primary schools to use photography to explore the idea of love. Starting on 14 February 2018, the fruit of these photography workshops-150 photographs-will appear in large format on the walls of the city and again in the spring at the Ateliers de l'Image.

The exhibition Jeunesse Éternelle [Eternal Youth] is being held at the Centre Photographique Marseille and at FRAC PACA in partnership with the CNAP. It is an intersecting and original interpretation of two works about youth that were commissioned by the Ministry of Culture over the past twenty years. What are the links between images and generations? What are the constants? What has changed?

After his celebrated work in the Pyramid of the Louvre in Paris, the artist has now been invited to create another immersive. luminous. and sensitive work that is in dialogue with the architecture of Pierre Puget. This will be an exceptional presentation of a unique piece by this internationally renowned artist.

CARLOS KUSNIR

This exhibition that has been conceived as part of MP2018 Quel Amour!, brings together ancient works and unique new creations that have been made specifically for these spaces. This exhibition has been imagined as a single tableau that spreads across two separate sites, the FRAC and the Tour Panorama of La Friche la Belle de Mai.

Sacred woman, goddess of nature, domestic maid cleaning homes and serving men, or Amazon woman, female centaur, guardian of the herd: Mothers, Marys, Marshes, Ecology of a Myth investigates the female figure in natural and cultural arenas that have long been the reserve of men.

By way of an exhibition and associated cultural programming that carries a feminine perspective, the project features artists such as **Suzanne Hetzel**,

Axelle Remeaud, and Mireille Loup along with scientists and researchers such as Helene Dattler for the Agence Nationale de Psychanalyse Urbaine and the sociologist Sophie Vignon, who explores the feminine role in the Camargue in the South of France and in the Doñana in Andalusia.



For seven months, love takes the form of a river and flows along a winding course with regular ports of call so that a theme, a discipline, a territory can be explored.
Enduring Love is a series of projects that are divided into multiple acts, resulting in a string of unique dates that spans the entire length of the artistic programme.

Thousand and One Nights

{february → august}

A dreamlike exploration across 37 of the territory's communities

A poetic expedition to venture out and see nightfall on the trail. To mark MP2018, the Bureau des Guides du GR2013© is offering an itinerant arts event that will take place along this peri-urban walking trail and among the 37 communities the GR2013© crosses as it travels between the Etang de Berre and the Massif de l'Etoile. The promise of a thousand and one nights of stories told in breath-taking spots along the trail in order to nurture a deeper understanding of the territory.

LISTEN, GLEAN, REGISTER, RECOUNT

A STORY, A PLACE... AND THE NIGHT TO TELL IT

In the beginning, there were stories. Eye-witness accounts, fabulous tales, local anecdotes, scientific discoveries, great industrial feats, or architectural adventures, the Bureau des Guides went out to gather all types of stories that provide a glimpse into the history of the territory, from Vitrolles to Aix-en-Provence, passing through Allauch, Marseille, and Miramas along the way. Collected on the GR®2013 trail, these pearls of stories are strung out to create a portrait of words that reflects our collective geography.

The Thousand and One Nights project will open this great book of legends and tales to bring people together, like children around a storyteller, to discover the mythology of the place where our everyday lives play out. Throughout the MP2018 event, Thousand and One Nights makes a date at nightfall to hear these stories in a series of stunning locations. During seven months, our territory will see a series of dreamlike events blossom before us. A filmconcert held in the middle of nature. A shared meal around a lecture or a concert on the edge of the city. Spectacular gatherings, festive bivouacs, walks with artists as guides, and random get-togethers among the hills and dales of the landscape... The Bureau des Guides du GR2013© takes us on a marvellous journey across the metropolis, enchanting our stories and our public spaces.



THE GR2013© HIKE DIFFERENTLY

Created during Marseille-Provence 2013, European Capital of Culture, the GR2013© is a 365-kilometre-long, peri-urban trail that provides a new perspective on the territory and an entirely different hiking experience. Crossing the countryside and subdivisions, cabins and scrublands, nature reserves and highways, the trail forms a sort of giant figure eight (which also happens to be the sign for infinity) on the scale of the entire territory.

Boots on their feet and faces to the wind, people become hikers and hikers are transformed into spectators. These are artistic hikes through urban spaces, hikes that move to the rhythm of footsteps, to the whims of contemplation.

→ The Bureau des Guides du GR2013©

brings together artist-walkers and a number of architecture collectives and artist-builders who have developed a concrete and poetic relationship with the territory. It coordinates the efforts of the different groups involved in the GR2013© trail (local governments, hiking associations and walking clubs, associations, artists, tourism and culture officials...) and offers walks along with cultural and artistic projects linked to the exploration of the territory. In partnership with Bouches-du-Rhône Tourisme and the FFRandonnée 13.

Estampette

{february > september}

Graphic Arts Numerous venues across the territory

A mobile print shop to create posters, cards, or group books in public spaces.

ONE PRINT SHOP, TWO WHEELS

A project imagined by Fotokino and Nicole Crème, Estampette is a nomadic module that travels throughout the city and sets itself up in neighbourhoods, in theatres, in front of libraries, or in public squares, and provides people with the opportunity to print their own works and to observe the creation of artworks in real time.

A JOYOUS MACHINE

It shows up where it isn't expected, it appears here and there, it's the Estampette, a roving print shop that will make everybody yearn to create and print their own works! Easy to use and easy to move, the Estampette provides people with an initiation in graphic design at the sides of established artists and graphic designers. It is an educational initiative as well as a generous one because it allows people to make their own images and create their own message inspired by the theme of love and togetherness, a message they can offer to their loved ones... or to total strangers! Alone or with a group, young or old, professional or amateur, keep an eye out for Estampette because it will appear in public spaces throughout the seven months of MP2018.

→ Fotokino has been active in the French graphic arts community for the past ten years. It specialises in itinerant events that occur in unique locations, while also running Studio Fotokino, a multi-disciplinary arts space that opened in Marseille in 2011. Every December, Fotokino organises the Laterna Magica festival.

→ Nicole Crême is a collective that is involved in both silkscreen printing and publishing projects. In 2013, the association opened its own exhibition and production space called La Crêmerie where numerous events are held that revolve around printed objects.

→ L'Estampette will travel along the GR2013© trail during the Thousand and One Nights events in partnership with the Bureau des Guides du GR2013©. It will also appear in Marseille in conjunction with Articho (an art association and publisher dedicated to illustrations), the Marelle, FRAC Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur, WAAW, and the Printemps de l'Art Contemporain.

Your Sea, Love of the Sea

{february → september}

Cuisine - In Marseille, Ensuès-La-Redonne, Carro, Martigues, Port-de-Bouc, Istres, Arles

From February to the start of September, art, cuisine, and the maritime environment express their love in a series of events that will be held along the coast from Marseille to Carro passing through Arles.

THE SEA, A PLACE FOR EVERYBODY

Your Sea, Love of the Sea examines the relationship we have with the sea and with the act of cooking. Chefs, authors, actors, stage directors, film directors, curators, photographers, multi-media artists... for several months, diverse talents will work to create ateliers and workshops that bring together different artists, fishermen and fisherwomen, farmers, and scientists who study the sea. These events will foster dialogues and share works so that audiences can experience unique moments where conversation, images, sounds, and tastes are shared.

THE KITCHEN, THE BEATING HEART OF THIS MULTIDISCIPLINARY PROJECT

Your Sea, Love of the Sea moves through the territory with a series of unique culinary and cultural events: walks, meals, banquets, artistic happenings, conferences, and performances that will examine the cultural, aesthetic, agricultural, economic, and political dimensions of our relationship with the sea.

SUPRISING LOCATIONS

An intersecting project that will take place in different locales along the Mediterranean coastline including cultural centres, the great outdoors, restaurants, oyster farms, farmers' fields, boats, and public squares will allow audiences to vividly experience these culinary tales.

→ I.C.I. is a cooperative organisation that was created to generate and produce projects linked to art and cuisine. It was formed as part of the Grandes Tables de l'Expérience event that was held by La Friche la Belle de Mai during Marseille-Provence 2013, European Capital of Culture. More than ten producers from different disciplines are part of the project, with the Alliance des Chefs providing an essential contribution thanks to its local and national presence. Within the framework of Your Sea, Love of the Sea, I.C.I. has initiated partnerships, some of which still need to be confirmed, with an array of structures including: Le Bureau des Guides du GR2013©, the Cinéma le Gyptis, the Citron Jaune CNAR, the Comité des fêtes de Carro, the Ecole Régionale d'Acteurs, La Friche la Belle de Mai, Radio Grenouille, Ground Control, the Institut Méditerranéen des Métiers du Spectacle, the Museum of Mediterranean Archaeology, the Musée Cantini, the Rencontres de la Photo, Revue 180°, Scènes et Cinés – Istres, the Théâtre de la Criée, Les Salins...

Write and Play Love

{14 feb. **→** 30 june}

Theatre Throughout the territory

Five original short pieces of theatre based on the theme of love will be performed at unusual sites around the territory

The Théâtre Joliette commissioned five authors to write short plays that will be staged by directors taking part in a residency programme and performed by a team of young actors. Five original pieces that will tour the territory and the department. The theme: love! These will be lighthearted works staged at schools, associations, social centres, businesses, libraries, and even in apartments.

Hip Hop Highlights

{february → may}

Multidisciplinary - Aubagne, Marseille & Martigues

This multidisciplinary event is dedicated to the territory's hip hop scene, which has been one of the most active in France and Europe since the 1980s. With this large-scale event, AMI and Radio Grenouille, along with roughly two dozen partners, are offering a rare opportunity to travel among the musical landscapes of a country that has emerged as the #2 hip hop nation in the world.

A MULTIDISCIPLINARY PROGRAMME

On the Programme: workshops and master classes, creative residencies, performances, concerts, conferences and debates, radio programmes, giant graffiti walls, film showings, and exhibitions, all emphasizing the major impact the hip hop community has had on the arts world.

Produced in conjunction with a network of organisations from different disciplines in Aubagne, Marseille and Martigues; A.M.I and Radio Grenouille, which both operate out of La Friche la Belle de Mai in Marseille; and a wealth of talented artists including dancers, musicians, beatboxers, DJs, graffiti artists, urban athletes, fashion designers, and multimedia authors. Picasso site, Conservatoire de Musique et de Danse à Martigues.

as part of the Impulsion festival produced by the C^{ie} En Phase in Aubagne.

⇒ From 1 to 05 May

with a week of concerts at venues throughout Marseille that will end with a massive day dedicated to hip hop at La Friche la Belle de Mai!

→ A.M.I. (Aide aux Musiques Innovatrices or Aid to Musical Innovations) is an association founded in 1985 by Ferdinand Richard that was originally dedicated to the Festival MIMI and now is one of the longest-running associations at La Friche la Belle de Mai. For the past 30 years, it has been devoted to the artistic, cultural, civic, and economic development of the territory for the betterment of the entire community.

THREE MAIN EPISODES

The Hip Hop Highlights programme features three main episodes built around events and co-creations based on the theme of Quel Amour! that will take place across the territory.

→ Radio Grenouille was born in a theatre (the Toursky) in 1981 and since 1991 has operated out of La Friche la Belle de Mai. It is a collective media outlet that also serves as an artistic producer-creator in such domains as sound, music, radio, and web. Active in the life of the city, oriented towards the Mediterranean, and connected to the world, Radio Grenouille can be heard at 88.8 FM in Marseille and on the Internet across the planet.

Wandering Love

{may → june}

Contemporary Music Artists native to the region

A Perfect Playlist and a nomadic Musical Caravan that moves between towns and cities for eight free concerts of contemporary music.

THE PERFECT PLAYLIST

First meeting, first night, first kiss, first vacation together, and behind it all there is usually music, music that gives a tempo to both our love and our friendships. Beyond Cupid's arrow, the music also sings of love for others, for diversity, for the planet... A playlist for making love, a playlist for kissing, a playlist to say "I love you" to, a playlist for friendship, a playlist for a love of risks and all the rest...

PAM is inviting us to experience the Perfect Playlist! A selection of emblematic songs by artists from the region that will be available across different platforms for a soundtrack that pulses to the beat of Quel Amour!

THE MUSICAL CARAVAN

Love and music go hand in hand and bring the Musical Caravan to life. It will be a nomadic performance that travels across the department and presents concerts by 20 of the artists whose songs appear on the Perfect Playlist. A mix between a concert and a walk, this roaming caravan of love will hit the territory's roads and create a dynamic link between communities, stopping in towns and cities to perform in public squares or prestigious halls, in out-of-the-way spots or intimate clubs. The caravan is equipped with an ingenious portable stage that can hold up to four musical groups; on the occasion of these free concerts it will be unfolded so that contemporary musicians from the region can perform their love songs.

A playlist and a caravan for a musical voyage that can be discovered by streaming it in your own home or by listening to it live in one of the cities/stopovers where the concerts will be held.

→ Le PAM - the Pôle de coopération des Acteurs de la filière Musicale in Région Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur, is the result of a joint project between two musical networks from the region: PHONOPACA, a group representing members of the music industry; and the Réseau TRëMA, a network of members of the contemporary music industry. When it was created, PAM brought together close to 80 organisations working in music in Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur and covered all types of musical activities including live performance, recorded music, music publishing, digital innovation, audio-visuals, training and resources, image creation, and new technologies.

Jam in the City

{february → june}

MP2018's Jazz Date Marseille, Vitrolles, Salon-de-Provence, La Ciotat

THE JAM SESSIONS SPIRIT

It's a state-of-mind, it's an impromptu date that will leave its impression on the territory: throughout MP2018, jam sessions will be held in different cities and different spaces to celebrate the love of music, the eagerness to share, and the need to bring together jazz musicians, musicophiles, and those who are just being introduced to the genre.

Jam sessions are a legendary part of the history of jazz, synonymous with unique moments of creation and unforgettable experiences that are as stunning as they are chaotic. They are an endless source of inspiration and foster musical connections that are founded on a common body of jazz standards but quickly dissolve boundaries and evolve into new creative expressions.

→ Jazz sur la Ville is a unique and open independent collective of venues, associations, and producers that are in love with jazz. Jazz sur la Ville is composed of 20 venues, more than 30 events, and close to 100 artistes. Jazz in all of its forms, from Africa to the United States, with influences from hard bop to electro, with a focus on both regional artists and international musicians. A vibrant, open jazz that draws from its roots while completely embodying its own era. A jazz that resembles Marseille, a doorway onto the world, where the mingling of styles is part of everyday life and diversity and difference are a strength.



SIX EXCEPTIONAL MUSICAL DATES ACROSS THE TERRITORY

The Jazz sur la Ville association is offering six dates for jazz to shine, a jazz that is modern, engaged, and open to all. With one date per month, audiences will be invited to attend improvised sessions at venues across the territory. Already booked is a gig at the Salon de Musique (Salon-de-Provence) where the pianist Adrien Chicot will be playing with Sylvain Romano and Jean-Pierre Arnaud, along with students from the IMFP; a concert at the Atelier Convergence in La Ciotat with young musicians from the region, including graduates from the conservatoires of Marseille/Aix-en-Provence and Toulon, some of whom were laureates at the Tremplin Jazz de Porquerolles. While waiting for the other Jam Sessions to be confirmed, it should be noted that the programme also includes a New York/Marseille concert with Le Jazzmeia Horn Quartet to be held at the Cri du Port and the Moulin à Jazz in Vitrolles, as well as a collaboration between Chicago and France with the 14th edition of The Bridge that will bring together Keefe Jackson and Dave Rempis from Chicago and Christine Wodrascka. Didier Lasserre, and Peter Orins from France in a show that will also include appearances by young amateur musicians.

THE QUEL AMOUR! ATELIERS

{february > september}

In the spirit of the Ateliers de l'EuroMéditerranée, which were one of the flagship events of MP2103, European Capital of Culture, MP2018 and Mécènes du Sud are reviving this dynamic residency programme by inviting artists to immerse themselves in the worlds of private companies throughout the territory where they will create original artworks.

ARTS RESIDENCIES IN BUSINESSES

In 2018, a dozen private companies that, as a rule, aren't involved in the arts or cultural activities, will welcome artists to create new works while immersed in the world of the business. This unique form of artistic hosting is an opening onto the other and encourages meetings between artists and both company employees and company clients throughout the residencies. Multimedia artists, videographers, and choreographers are but some of the artists that will present works created during these residencies as part of the Quel Amour! programme.

AN EXTRAORDINARY UNDERTAKING

With the revival of this residency programme, MP2018 and Mécènes du Sud are fostering interactions with new audiences and nurturing innovative modes of artistic production. This marriage between artists and businesses takes the form of a reciprocal commitment where the time given over to new encounters and relationships leads to the exploration of a company's savoir-faire and, more broadly speaking, of the world of business.

A FEW EXAMPLES OF THE QUEL AMOUR! ATELIERS

Installation, sculpture, performance, video, dance, stage design...

A diversity of artistic disciplines will be featured throughout the Quel Amour! Ateliers programme, all following the "trio" system of artist/host/arts space.



With *Forever, happily...*, the **Collectif Malunés** renews the world of fairy tales and offers a very personal version of love. At Mira mas, **Josette Baïz** presents *Amor*, a constellation of pieces celebrating love in all its states. I LOVE CLASSICS !

Weddings, betrayals, tragic passions, love of freedom, troubled friendships or burning desires. The classic repertoire has been lighting up love for centuries. After the winter vacation, MP2018 is inviting everybody to the department's theatres for a programme honouring contemporary performances of major works. All of which, of course, will embrace the same central theme: love in all its shapes and sizes!

Betrayed loves and opportune seductions fill the show Tartuffe d'après Tartuffe d'après Tartuffe d'après Molière at Le Merlan in March. A one-man show by Guillaume Maillart who plays different characters with brio including Orgon, Elmire, Marianne, Valère, Cléante, and Mme. Pernelle in a spirited series of performances. At Les Salins, we find the broken affairs and renewed loves of Marivaux's Double Inconstancy (or Almost), directed by Jean-Michel Rabeux, according to whom "we can view all of Marivaux's work as a playful and profound reflection on the various definitions of the word 'love.' He speaks of friendship, romantic or other, of passing or permanent troubles, of marital life as well as of passion." At La Criée, several shows will explore this theme: Ce n'est pas une histoire d'amour, c'est l'histoire de l'Amour [This is not a Love Story, it's the Story of Love], directed by Laurent Daycard, in which a storyteller shares the story of Tristan and Iseult, the tale of two young lovers from Brittany forced to unite in death, having not had the chance to love each other in life. In La Tragédie de Macbeth [The Tragedy of Macbeth], Lady Macbeth's venomous desire takes

over **Frédéric Bélier-Garcia** production. Written by Shakespeare in 1605, "Macbeth is a play about desire. Not the desire for something, but the desire to be someone other than oneself (taller, higher up, or simply different). A cursed desire, but one that nonetheless haunts us all. It's as if a confused, sleepless voice inside of us cannot cease to proclaim its dissatisfaction with the place we were given on this earth."

In Flaubert's *Bouvard et Pécuchet*, the absurd love of two burlesque heroes offers **Jérôme Deschamps** the opportunity to create a new version full of both hilarity and tenderness, and above all a joyful wickedness that redeems this major work of literature.

Dance is also revisiting the classics, with the performance *Carmen(s)* by **José Montalvo** at the Grand Théâtre de Provence, which offers a choreographic version of Bizet's famous opera. Carmen, a woman who epitomizes the love of freedom.

is an annual Marseille festival whose goal is to promote and participate in the development of contemporary dance around the Mediterranean basin. It is organised by L'Officina, an association that seeks to help in the creation, production, and distribution of different art forms, while also developing a network of international exchange.

DREAM FACTORY

The Festival de Marseille strikes out in preparation for its summer extravaganza (from 14 June to 8 July) with a co-creative exploratory project between the city, its residents, and artists hailing from the other side of the Mediterranean. How can we reimagine what it means to "be a city together"? How can making art together be a civic act? How can we forge links between the activist and the artist?

➡ Parallèle

is a platform that is dedicated to young international contemporary artists. It supports the production and dissemination of projects, and organises an eponymous festival every year in different locations around Marseille honouring emerging artists.

→ Le Festival de Marseille

A festival dedicated to dance and to a variety of other art forms, a mix between genres and cultures. Hybrid, festive, adventurous, the Festival de Marseille moves in synch with the beat and the image of the city

TWO MONUMENTAL FRESCOS / LEVAT CONVENT

{early may}: 1st fresco / {june}: 2nd fresco

As Part of the Contemporary Urban Art Exhibition (june-october) - Marseille

Building on the success of the residency-exhibition Aux Tableaux! at the Saint-Thomas d'Aquin school, starting in January 2017, the Atelier Juxtapoz has been given three years of free reign at the Levat convent in the Belle de Mai neighbourhood. The location is a deconsecrated chapel and convent built on 1.7 hectares of gardens that is now open to artists and the public after having been the home of the order of the Soeurs Victimes du Sacré-Coeur de Jésus order since 1843.

For the first major event at this new "artist city" an urban art exhibition will be installed in the old Levat convent in the spring of 2018. MP2018 is joining forces with Juxtapoz to create two monumental frescoes based on the theme "Quel Amour!".

SUSTAINABLE MONUMENTAL WORKS

Atelier Juxtapox and MP2018 are coproducing the creation of two monumental works.

Starting in early May, a renowned international artist will sign their name on the first environmentally sustainable façade in the city's public space. The work will be based on the theme "Quel Amour!" and the signing will take place during a performance that will last several days and that will bring together the street art and hip hop scenes. The second work will come to life on a giant 9x35 meter-long façade in the heart of the Levat garden on the opening night of the urban art exhibition that takes place from June to October 2018. A crew of two international artists has been approached to create this colossal on-site piece.

AN INTERNATIONAL URBAN ART EXHIBITION

For four months, an international urban art exhibition will bring together about thirty national and international artists. Within the old convent and on its exterior walls, the public will be able to follow an artistic pathway and discover works from a variety of different disciplines: paintings, sculptures, installations, sound creations...The works will be created on-site during a residency leading up to the event, during which the artists will develop their work in dialogue with this unique place. In the spirit of this reanimated and reimagined convent, the exhibition will also offer a vibrant weekly programme with conferences about urban art, performances, projections, and concerts to enrich the public's experience.



➡ l'Atelier Juxtapoz

Created in 2009, the Atelier Juxtapoz group most notably initiated the MUR-Marseille project, an open-air exhibition space. Then, in 2015 the group organised Aux Tableaux!, a collective exhibition in which forty artists were given the opportunity to use the old Saint-Thomas D'Aquin school as their creative playground.

The exhibition's 2500 m² of space attracted more than 43 000 visitors. Based on this experience, the City of Marseille entrusted Atelier Juxtapoz with the old Levat convent and were given three years of free reign. The association is now setting up its "artist city", a sustainable, moderately priced space that brings together artists, artisans, and independents, fostering creativity and interactions between disciplines.

MASSILIA AFROPÉA

MP2018 is joining forces with the second edition of this multidisciplinary event celebrating the creativity of French Afropeans by supporting its development in the La Savine neighbourhood of Marseille.

CELEBRATING THE AFRODESCENDANT CREATIVE COMMUNITY

Conceived by Eva Doumbia, director of the La Part du Pauvre/Nana Triban campaign, the first edition of the Massilia Afropéa was held in October 2016 at La Friche la Belle de Mai. It offered a socially and ethnically diverse audience the opportunity to discover a programme honouring the writing of French Afrodescendants. For its second edition, the festival is widening the scope of its partners and is teaming up with La Friche de la Belle de Mai, the Théâtre de la Criée, and the Festival de Marseille in partnership with the ANIF, Les Rosas and Sound Musical School.

MASSILIA AFROPÉA 2018, THE QUEL AMOUR! EDITION

As part of MP2018, Massilia Afropéa is offering to develop a large part of its programme in an isolated part of northern Marseille: La Savine. The neighbourhood will host the event with a series of shows, performances, encounters, and concerts, all set to the rhythm of Quel Amour! Programme in the La Savine neighbourhood (subject to change): A musical show by Casey, Mohamed Mbaé Tahamida, known as Soly, and Imhotep (IAM) in memory of Ibrahim Ali, in the spirit of brotherly love. A performance of Au plus noir de la nuit [Looking on Darkness], based on the novel of the same name by André Brink, which tells the story of a dangerous passion between a black man and a white woman during Apartheid. The piece is directed by Nelson Rafaell Madel, a brilliant actor who notably performed beside Christiane Taubira this summer in Avignon. Badine [Trifle], by Eva Doumbia and based on Alfred de Musset's famous play, which will be taking place in several locations: social centres, the halls of buildings, walking through apartments. Simultaneously, the company will declare their love to the residents of La Savine in their performances of texts written by British playwright debbie tucker green. An open-air projection of Vers la tendresse [Towards Tenderness], the César-winning short film by Alice Diop that tells the story of the love between two young men in the La Courneuve neighbourhood in the suburbs of Paris. Imany will be hosting a workshop for young artists on the occasion of her concert at the Théâtre de la Criée in May, in partnership with Marseille Concerts. "Self-esteem" workshops with Boucle d'Ebène and a series of thematic and musical shows on Radio Grenouille.

→ La Part du Pauvre/Nana Triban

was founded in 2000 by theatre director Eva Doumbia. The company seeks to bring visibility to France and Europe's cultural diversity, and to create political connections and artistic collaborations with the African continent, the Caribbean, and the Americas. After having worked on the themes of immigration and ethnic mixing for a long time, the company is now focusing on Afropeanism, following in the footsteps of Léonora Miano, who said: "We must formulate the concept of Afropeanism so that it exists, so that we can understand that the blacks that we see in the street are not necessarily immigrants. Some couldn't even care less about Africa, and that is their right."

CROSS - BORDER LOVES

MP2018 is celebrating otherness through a series of projects dealing with borders, both terrestrial and celestial. These cross-border loves will manifest as joyous artistic encounters with the Other.

From Autumn 2017 to August 2018, a long-term residency will result in Belgian artist and researcher Thomas Bellinck presenting an updated version of his exhibition House of European History in Exile and of his show *Simple as ABC–Part II: Keep Calm and Validate*.

There will be projects that will question Europe and its fraternal tendencies. Two of the greatest love stories in the East and the West will meet in *Orfeo & Majnun*, a project mixing urban walking and opera in Arles and Aix-en-Provence.

In May, the 10th anniversary edition of the Printemps de l'Art Contemporain will be honouring Scotland with *Love Letters*, a project conceived by Marseille Expos. We will also be looking upward for the Exo project, with its lasers tracing lines between the ground and the deep sky, weaving the framework of a passionate declaration of love to the stars.

INVENTING THE EUROPE OF TOMORROW

Theatre and Visual Arts *Marseille, Cassis & Aix-en-Provence*

Quel Amour/What Love for Europe Today? The Théâtre La Cité, the Fondation Camargo, the Maison Méditerraneéenne des Sciences de l'Homme, and the Festival de Marseille in partnership with the MuCEM, are coming together to welcome artist and researcher **Thomas Bellinck** for a residency in 2018. This will be an opportunity to present the updated version of his exhibition Domo de *Eŭropa Historio en Ekzilo* [House of European History in Exile] and his *show Simple as ABC #2: Keep Calm & Validate.*

A TERRITORIAL RESIDENCY

"What Europe will we want to live in tomorrow? How do the Mediterranean's great values—values such as openness, hospitality, solidarity, and intercultural exchange and which are at the heart of the territory—enrich the Europe of tomorrow? How do we nourish and cultivate this territory and, in the larger European context, our own self-love as Mediterranean and European citizens? And from this acceptance of who we are and where we come from, how do we integrate love for the Other in this project for a shared future?" In 2018, Thomas Bellinck will make Marseille, Aix-en-Provence, and Cassis the setting for his artistic and intellectual research dealing with the question of the Euro-Mediterranean. Throughout the residency, he will work with both native and new populations of the territory, an exercise that will fuel both existing and future projects.

SIMPLE AS ABC #2 : KEEP CALM & VALIDATE

As part of the Biennale des écritures du réel #4, launched by Le Théâtre La Cité, Simple as *ABC* #2: *Keep Calm & Validate* is the second part of a series of works dedicated to one of the most complex phenomena of the 21st century: the migrant crisis in the West. In 2015, **Thomas Bellinck** collaborated with artist and set designer Jozef **Wouters** to create Simple as *ABC#1: Man vs Machine*, a brief project for a large room that dealt with surveillance technology. The next step in this effort, *Simple as ABC #2: Keep Calm & Validate*, is a documentary musical about the digitisation of migrant management and the outsourcing of our unease about social sorting.



DOMO DE EŬROPA HISTORIO EN EKZILO

The Festival de Marseille and the MuCEM present the first French exhibition of iconoclastic artist Thomas Bellinck.

Domo de Eŭropa Historio en Ekzilo [House of *European History in Exile]* is told from the future and takes the audience more than half a century back in time to the early twenty-first century. Although little-studied, this period nevertheless provided the breeding-ground for the sweeping changes that were to take place during our century. It was a remarkable era, characterised by the Integration and the Harmonization. Blessed by the Long Peace. Overshadowed by the Great Recession. Back when national borders were blurred and people everywhere used a single currency called the "euro". Back when Brussels, not Warsaw, lay at the beating heart of the old continent. The first international exhibition on life in the former European Union.

→ Thomas Bellinck

Belgian artist and researcher Thomas Bellinck puts the European question at the heart of his process, working across various mediums (theatre, performance, visual arts, cinema), and with both professional and amateur participants (actors, but also migrants and citizens). European and non-European territories are the grounds for his artistic and intellectual research on European borders and in his work on newcomers: Brussels as capital of Europe, Eastern Europe, where he spent part of his childhood, Spain, Greece, and the island of Lampedusa, and in his search for Europe's borders and his work with newcomers.

ORFEO & MAJNUN

Orfeo et Majnun [Orfeo and Majnun], or the meeting between two tragic love stories: the Greek myth of Orpheus and Eurydice and the Persian legend of Layla and Majnun. A major creation in the form of two participatory parades in the cities of Arles and Aix-en-Provence and an opera performed on the Cours Mirabeau in Aix-en-Provence.

TRAGIC LOVE AT THE MEETING BETWEEN EAST AND WEST

Orfeo & Majnun aligns the Greek myth of Orpheus and Eurydice with the Persian legends of Layla and Majnun. Having both become the very incarnation of poetry and song in their respective cultures, Orpheus and Majnun share a common destiny. Separated from their loves, they retreated from the world to pour out their pain and extol their passion in magnificent poems. At the heart of both of these stories of tragic love is the power of music, capable of transcending absence, of defying death, and of charming both gods and wild beasts.

A PARTICIPATORY OPERA

An exceptional project, Orfeo & Majnun brings the musical traditions of East and West together in a contemporary piece. Two Arab-speaking soloists (Layla and Majnun), two Englishspeaking soloists (Orpheus and Eurydice), a French-speaking narrator and an orchestra made up of both professional and amateur musicians, accompanied by an amateur chorus of 150 singers, bring life to this unique work directed by Airan Berg. Presented in July 2018 at the Festival d'Aix-en-Provence, this opera will follow grand participatory parades that will take place throughout Europe including in Brussels, Arles, Aix-en-Provence, La Valette, Krakow, Rotterdam, and Santa Maria de Feira in Portugal. Great animated beasts, created by visual artist Roger Titley, will be part of the opera's set design and will create a link between the opera and the parades.



TWO GREAT URBAN PARADES

As part of the MP2018 Quel Amour!, the Les Suds in Arles festival and the Festival d'Aix en Provence are coproducing two large-scale urban parades under the artistic direction of Airan Berg, with Raphaël Imbert as artistic coordinator. The parade will be taking place on 8 April in Arles as part of the Drôle de Carnaval and on 14 June in Aix-en-Provence, ahead of the performance of the opera Orfeo & Majnun, scheduled on 8 July. Bringing together talents from all over the territory, the two musical parades will be accompanied by the creatures that appear in the opera, and by the audience itself. This is an opportunity for everybody to participate in workshops that will be taking place in the weeks before the parades: there will be voice, instrument or choreography practice along with puppet and animal mask-building, which will allow everyone to participate and bring to life one of the metaphorical characters that make up the parade or even to join in the amateur choir!

AN IMPETUS TOWARD OPENNESS

What if the generous openness and optimism of a territory were the source of its wealth? Faced with the contemporary temptation to withdraw, the visual arts scene of the Aix-Marseille-Provence Metropolis affirms the urgency of multiplying exchanges with artists from other horizons and different disciplines. Considering the rich history of the relationship between Scotland and artists from the Provence area, in 2018 Scotland was chosen as the first guest in a series of invitations sent out to artistic scenes across Europe, thus confirming the Printemps de l'Art Contemporain as a truly international contemporary art festival.

PRESTIGIOUS GUESTS

Rachel MacLean and **Martin Boyce**, who represented Scotland at the Venice Biennale in 2017 and 2009, respectively, are among the artists who have responded positively to the invitation. Rachel McLean will reveal the full exuberance of her work in a monographic exhibition at the Château de Servières. Martin Boyce will be fulfilling a residency at the Centre International de Recherche sur le Verre et les Arts (CIRVA), which will lead to other projects in collaboration with the FRAC, the Centre Photographique de Marseille, and Atlantis.

MARSEILLE EXPOS PLAYS THE MATCHMAKER

Love Letters is offering nearly two dozen exhibitions and events, creating countless chances of crossing glances with a Scottish or a French artist. On the bill for this month of May: cross-border creative residencies, workshops and exchanges between the students and teachers from art schools in Marseille and Glasgow, solo and colletive exhibitions, a bi-national curatorial project, a Franco-Scottish publication, etc.

Created in 2007, **Marseille Expos** is an arts network whose objective is to bring together and promote contemporary art in the Aix-Marseille-Provence Metropolis. The federation thus fosters the sharing of information, experiences and know-how, mutualises the network of artists and professionals, and seeks to attract a diversity of different and complimentary audiences.


