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Escale, Horizon and Balancine Suites The 3 new Suites of the Hotel Barrière Le Majestic Cannes





As it prepares to reopen its doors, the Hotel Barrière Le Majestic Cannes is brimming with creativity, its optimism and ambition as strong as ever in its desire to offer its guests the most exciting and relaxed stay possible. The palace-hotel's three new Signatures Suites bear witness to this. Named Escale, Horizon and Balancine and with an ambience that is as refined as it is inspired, these large suites combine a sense of space and elegance, luxury and freedom.

The time to reopen is fast approaching for Le Majestic, one of the jewels in the crown of the famous Croisette. From the month of May onwards, it will once again welcome guests with the firm intention of helping them forget a 2020 and early part of 2021 marked by the Covid pandemic.

Part of this approach is based on top-level dining options*, brought firmly up to date by its dream team (Nicole Rubi, Pierre Gagnaire, Mauro Colagreco and Emanuele Balestra) and by its new Majestic Experiences* programme of leisure activities which is as varied as it is unique, and which can be enjoyed both inside and outside of the hotel. Nor has this five-star property on the French Riviera neglected what has already cemented its reputation the world over, namely the quality of its accommodation. Proof of this is the addition of three new jewels in its collection of Signature Suites, which offer optimal levels of comfort and pleasure that are certain to please the most demanding of guests.

Cast off

The first two of these superb Suites, both boasting 280m² of floor space, have been given the names Escale (port of call) and Horizon – two words which immediately bring to mind travel and the sea. The appropriateness of these names becomes clearly apparent as soon as you enter the lounge of both suites, with their stunning views of the Mediterranean and the Lérins islands. From their beautiful terraces, it's easy to imagine yourself on a luxury cruise

ship anchored in the Bay of Cannes. The wooden parquet flooring and loungers perfect for sunbathing add to the relaxing holiday feel.

As must be obvious by now, these two new luxury Suites at this palace-Hotel in Cannes play with the theme of the cruise ship. The decor in the rooms, the work of Chantal Peyrat, one of the Hotel's appointed interior designers, features numerous references to the world of pleasure cruising. There are knick-knacks which wouldn't look out of place in an old sea-dog's cabin, such as the telescope perched on its wooden tripod facing out to sea. Or the huge leather, brass and mirror headboard which the designer has playfully criss-crossed with dozens of small ropes that bring to mind an old sailing ship. Even the carpet has a hint of the sea about it: its original motif creates the illusion of a white sandy beach rippled by a gentle sea breeze.

Raise the mainsail

With two bedrooms flanking a large lounge that opens on to a wide terrace, the hotel's new 170m² Balancine Suite also offers guests a real sense of space, which is emphasised, as in the Escale and Horizon Suites, by its superb views of the Bay of Cannes. Here again, Chantal Peyrat has taken inspiration from this magnificent panorama, choosing a theme for the suite's decor that couldn't be more maritime, namely sailing. As soon as you set foot in the suite, you'll be struck by its soft, elegant and light feel, enhanced here and there with shades of beige and driftwood, back-lit sails as artwork, armchairs with pleated backs, brown leather sofas, bed headrests with brass braiding, and low tables decked in bronze. The name is just as evocative: balancine is the French word for the line that controls the boom on a yacht!

When the exceptional is the rule

Escale, Horizon and Balancine perfectly complement the five Signature Suites previously opened by the Majestic. They bring a new nuance to the yachting theme already explored by the hotel in its Riviera Suite and Majestic Penthouse, the latter a superb 600m² suite which offers its VIP guests ultra-luxurious accommodation, an extraordinary roof terrace and a private infinity swimming pool.

In contrast to this nautical mood, some guests at this palace-hotel may prefer the glamour of the Mélodie Suite, inspired by the cinematic masterpiece by Henri Verneuil (Mélodie en sous-sol, or Any Number Can Win), the Michèle Morgan Suite, an elegant and subtle tribute to one of the great actresses of French cinema, or the Christian Dior Penthouse, 450m² of space which has been entirely decked out by the famous fashion house, a long-established partner of the Majestic during the Cannes Film Festival.

Quite simply, those guests who head to the Croisette in search of excellence, unique character and space are spoilt for choice here. After all, isn't it said that choice is the real luxury?
