Midi-Pyrenees Tourist Board – At the heart of Southwest France, Midi-Pyrenees is a destination notable for its gastronomic specialties (like Roquefort cheese and Armagnac) and 26 Great Tourist Sites, including medieval villages, battered castles, gorges and navigable canals. Its newest star attraction, the Rodez-based Soulages Museum dedicated to its namesake artist, has attracted nearly three times more visitors than expected, a number likely to grow in spring 2016 during a temporary Picasso exhibit. Picasso is also be on display through January 2016 at Les Abbatoirs, the modern art museum of Toulouse. Two other new Toulouse museums are seeing great success: Aéroscopia, which focuses on aeronautics, has far exceeded visitation expectations; and the Dom Robert Museum,which displays 20th-century tapestries. <u>Readmore</u>
